



4-Year-Old Kindergarten

Starting with the 2005-2006 school year, the School District of Hilbert began to offer families a new option in educational services.

- The School District of Hilbert will use the Wisconsin Model Early Learning Standards in creating a developmentally appropriate environment and learning setting.
- A curriculum that provides a strong literacy component (listening, speaking, thinking, phonemic awareness, emergent writing) will be based upon established standards and developmentally appropriate, research-based practice.
- A balance of all learning areas (literacy, fine motor, gross motor, math, science, social studies, art, music, social, and self-care) offered in an integrated manner, and reflecting the holistic nature of early learning will be used.



Program Information

- The 4K program is for everyone, regardless of ability or income. Students must be 4 years old as of September 1st of the school year. Four-Year Old Kindergarten is not intended to be an alternative to Five-Year-Old Kindergarten.
- The 4K program is staffed by highly qualified personnel, including a full-time teacher assigned to the classroom.
- Beginning in 2021/22, the 4K program went to four (4) full days Monday through Thursday. One day each week will be used for family outreach and planning.
- Ideal enrollment will be 15-16 students and maximum class enrollment will be around 20 per session.
- Busing will be available for students in 4K.
